# PARKER RAMSAY'S ELY CATHEDRAL RECITAL DEBUT

Nashville AGO Chapter members will be delighted to know that our young chapter member, Parker Ramsay, just beginning his second year of study as Organ Scholar at the King's School at Ely Cathedral in England, covered himself with glory in his English Cathedral recital debut on August 31st. It concluded a prestigious summer series that included Simon Preston among other well-known names

The program began with an exuberant account of Bach's E flat Prelude and Fugue, complete with added ornamentation; the following trio on "Herr Jesu Christ, dich zu uns wend" was delicately registered and neatly played (no small feat in the cathedral's vast acoustic). There followed two Fantasias by Jehain Alain, possibly the finest playing of the evening, using the colour resources of the instrument and the cathedral's rolling resonance to maximum effect. He concluded with two movements from Messiaen's "La Nativite." "Desseisn eternelles" was a mystical wash of sound that floated through the Gothic arches in the late afternoon sun, while "Dieu parmi nous" had all the flash and pizzazz one could ask for. Bravo. Parker!

By the time members read this, Parker will be in the throes of the try-outs for Organi Scholarships at the major Oxford and Cambridge colleges. We wish him well! And Paul Trepte, Organist and Choirmaster at the Cathedral, is delighted that Parker will be able to join the Men and Boys of Ely Cathedral choir on their US tour – including an appearance at St. George's at 7:30 on October 25.

# PARKER RAMSAY TO KING'S COLLEGE, CAMBRIDGE


All members of our chapter will doubtless be thrilled to learn that our young chapter member Parker Ramsay has been informed that he has been elected Organ Scholar of King's College, Cambridge, beginning his studies there in 2010.

Ironically enough, he received this news as he was actually in Oxford(!), preparing to sit the organ scholarship exams there, having sat the Cambridge exams on Monday and Tuesday.

He will be the first non-Commonwealth Organ Scholar ever appointed at King's (indeed in any Cambridge college.) He will therefore be the first American Organ Scholar there. His duties will be to accompany the world-famous King's College Choir for daily services, concerts, recordings, tours and broadcasts, including the world-wide live BBC radio broadcast of the Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols on Christmas Eve. The men and boys choir of King's College was founded by King Henry VI in 1444, and now sings services in the glorious fan-vaulted Chapel, one of the most famous works of Perpendicular Gothic architecture in the world. <a href="http://www.kings.cam.ac.uk/chapel/choir/index.html">http://www.kings.cam.ac.uk/chapel/choir/index.html</a>

We wish Parker well in this exciting and prestigious opportunity. Between now and then he will continue his studies at the King's School, Ely, and playing for services and concerts in Ely Cathedral. He will also join Ely Cathedral Choir on their tour of the US next month, performing in Nashville at St. George's Church on Saturday, October 25.
