

### **TRIO MEETINGS**

In late June, we will host representatives of the AGO National Committee on Conventions as plans progress for our 2012 AGO National Convention. These meetings are the next big step toward preparing an overall convention plan, which will be submitted to National in October 2010.

During their two-day visit to Nashville, three members of the National Committee on Conventions will meet individually with many of the convention committee chairs, and also with the full Convention Steering Committee. These meetings are referred to as "Trio meetings." The National representatives who make up the "Trio" are James Thomashower, Executive Director of the AGO; Dennis Elwell, Councillor for AGO Conventions; and Ronald Vanderwest, Coordinator for the Chicago AGO National Convention, and, now, the Chair of the National Committee for Conventions. This will be Ronald Vanderwest's first official visit to Nashville.

I am very grateful for all of the good work that has been, and is being done by our Chair People and their excellent committees. We are planning to host a superb AGO National Convention. By the time the Convention arrives, every chapter member will have been called upon to work. We have one of the best and most active chapters in the country, and I am confident we will put our best foot forward.
