She has performed in venues including the *Cathédrale Poitiers, Église Notre-Dame* (Épernay, France), Mechanics Hall, St. Patrick's Cathedral, and the Kotschmar Memorial Organ of Merrill Auditorium (Portland, ME). Ms. Emerson is currently a junior at Oberlin College and Conservatory (Oberlin, OH) where she studies with James David Christie and pursues bachelor's degrees in organ performance and French with minors in music history and historical performance (fortepiano).

Frances Southerland, long-time organist and director at historic Tulip Street United Methodist Church, was the music teacher of some of our chapter members, and gave a musical start to hundreds of kids in our community. Anna Forrester was tireless as she "worked the phones" and called AGO members for dinner reservations. She had a unique knowledge of our membership, which proved invaluable timeafter-time. During Nashville '95, she and her husband Joe were so helpful to many travelers to Nashville. I remember each of these four affectionately and offer thanks for their lives among us. *Requiescat in pace*.


Instructions for Mailing Absentee Ballot
